Commentary

Although strong, there are reported signs of weakening for prime slaughter bulls and heifers in January compared to the December averages. Some market participants have also indicated some softening of prices offered for mature bulls and cows in some markets. There are also reports that there is some retail price resistance in some markets. The market in the U.S. remains relatively strong despite the problems in the economy. In the Canadian market, the value of the Canadian dollar has assisted in maintaining the market at present levels. Nationally federal slaughter for 2008 was up 8% (20,990 in 2008 compared to 19,424 for the same period in 2007). Exports of live animals to the end of November were up 48% (27,436 in 2008 compared to 18,527 in 2007). Total boneless bison meat exports to the end of November 2008 have declined by 4.5% (1,056,790 Kg. in 2008 compared to 1,106,587 Kg. in 2007). There has been continued growth in bison meat exports to the U.S. and France. This data does not reflect the Canadian bison slaughtered in the U.S. where the meat is exported to Europe. Such data is not readily available.

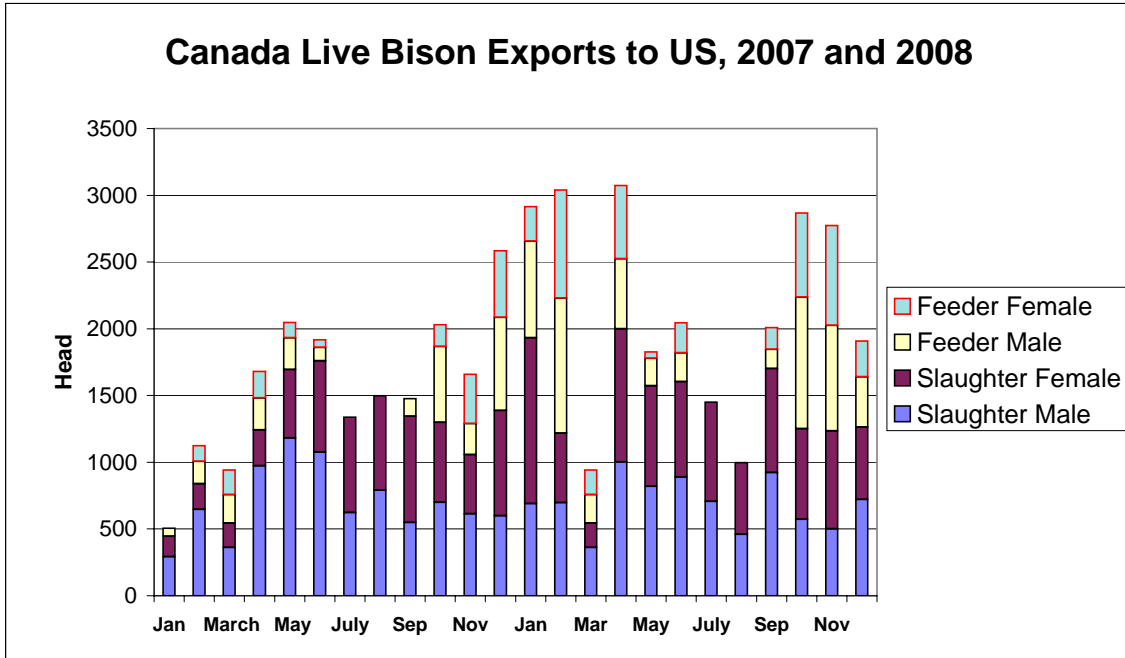
