Commentary

Marketers report continued strong demand and strong prices for bison trim in the US and Canada. Compared to last month, prices for fresh tenderloin and boneless strip loins, although strong have softened. The strengthening of the Canadian dollar has also had an impact on prices. With the warmer weather and the summer grilling season upon us, a strong demand is expected to continue for ground bison and other barbecue cuts. Some marketers are still concerned about the level of frozen middle cuts inventory.

The strong trim prices have resulted in an increase in the prices of mature bulls and cows with prime bull and heifer prices holding steady.

Nationally federal slaughter for the first 22 weeks was down only slightly (8,997 in 2009 compared to 9,043 for the same period in 2008). Exports of live animals to April 30 were down by 30% (8,623 in 2009 compared to 12,366 in 2008). The decline in live exports is due to the short supply of animals combined with the stronger Canadian dollar.

Total boneless bison meat exports for the first quarter were about the same in 2009 when compared to 2008 (299,884 Kg. in 2009 compared to 298,048 Kg. in 2008). There has been an increase in boneless exports to the U.S. with less boneless bison meat being shipped to France. To June 3, 2009, 99,636 Kg of bison meat was shipped into Canada from the U.S. Much of this bison meat is likely from animals of Canadian origin that were slaughtered in the U.S. with cuts not destined for the EU or the U.S. markets being marketed in Canada.

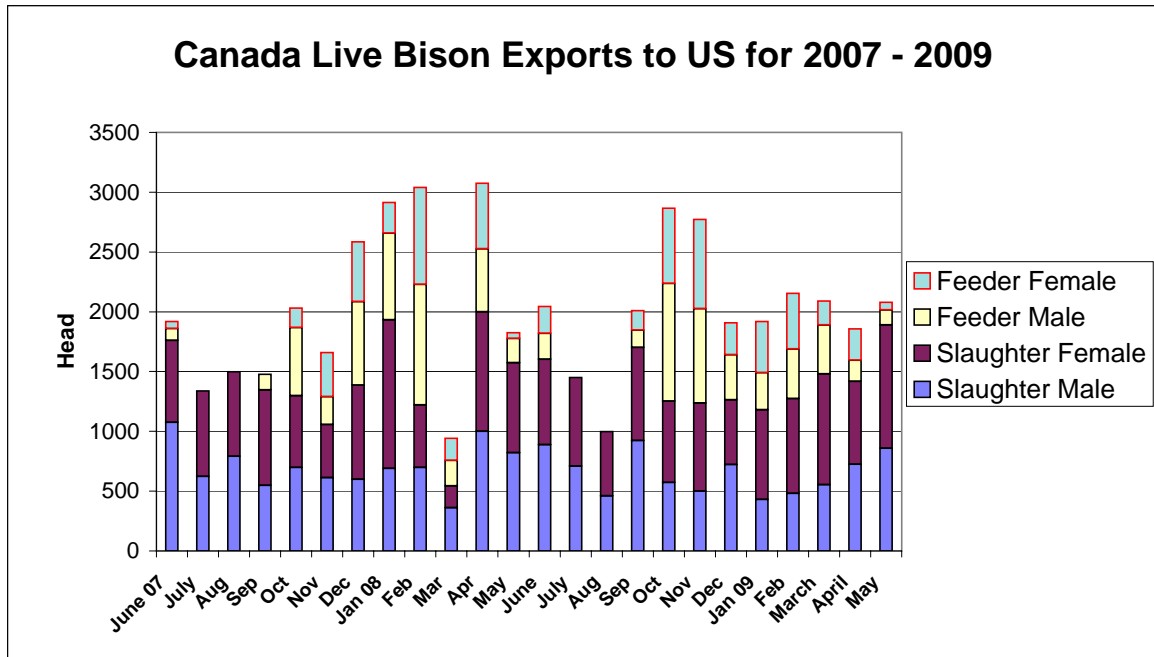
