Commentary

Marketers report continued strong demand and strong prices for bison trim. Middle cuts (tenders, strips and ribeyes) continue to be in good supply creating downward pressure on prices. In many parts of the country poor weather conditions for grilling have had a negative impact on the demand for middle cuts. Some of this inventory may be reduced if good weather extends the grilling season well into the fall.

The strong trim prices have resulted in continued strong prices for mature bulls and cows with prime bull and heifer prices holding steady.

Nationally federal slaughter for the first 27 weeks was up slightly (10,827 in 2009 compared to 10,811 for the same period in 2008). Exports of live animals to May 31 were down by 28% (10,269 in 2009 compared to 14,278 in 2008). The decline in live exports is due to the short supply of animals combined with the stronger Canadian dollar.

Total boneless bison meat exports for the first quarter were down to May 31, 2009 when compared to 2008 (374,870 Kg. in 2009 compared to 413,983 Kg. in 2008). There has been an increase in boneless exports to the U.S. with less boneless bison meat being shipped to France.

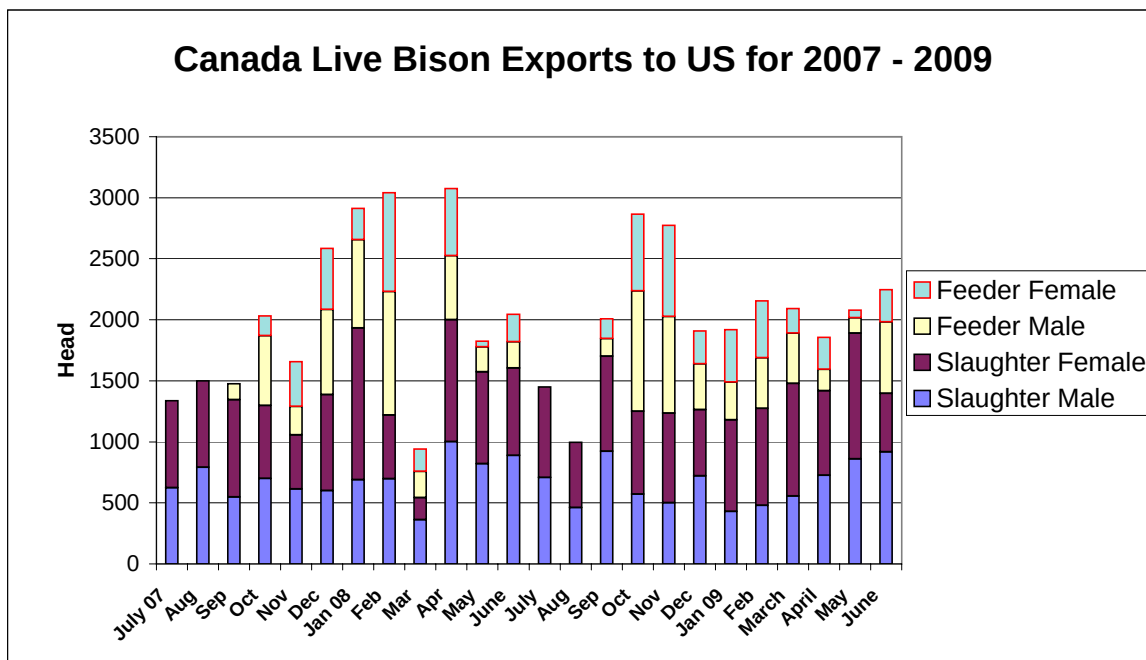
